TEARS ON BLACK LEATHER

Brothers and Sisters Down or Gone

The Marine Corps Toys for Tots Coordinator for the Chattanooga area has been seriously injured in a motorcycle collision with an SUV.

Sgt. Adam Biggs, who also is a veteran of the fighting in Iraq, is in the Surgical Intensive Care unit of Erlanger Medical Center, according to Gunnery Sgt. Michael D. Hamby of the local Marine Reserve Center.

Sgt. Biggs was riding his motorcycle southbound on Highway 153 last Thursday when he was hit by the SUV.

Sgt. Hamby said he sustained traumatic injuries to his lower extremities, including a broken left femur, fracture of the left pelvis, three broken ribs and loss of his spleen. He said his lower left leg was shattered from the knee down.

Sgt. Hamby said, "Currently he is in the Surgical ICU at Erlanger Medical Complex awaiting his blood count to come up to start surgery. The driver of the SUV has insurance, but not nearly enough coverage to cover the medical bills and the family from Senoia, Ga., is experiencing financial hardships staying in Chattanooga.

"We have opened up a fundraiser account at Tennessee Valley Federal Credit Union Account Number 104245, Sgt. Adam E. Biggs. This Marine has done a great deal of work for Chattanooga and surrounding communities with his Annual Toys for Tots efforts."

He said Sgt. Briggs had collected a total of 60,471 toys

and assisted the needs of over 16,000 families. Sgt. Biggs also deployed with Mike Battery to Iraq in support of operation Iraqi Freedom 2 and was involved in the fight to take control of the city of Al Fallujah.

Sgt. Hamby said, "It would be great if we the community could pull together and assist Sgt Biggs and his family during this time.

Motorcyclist Critically Injured In I-75 Crash September 18, 2006

A motorcyclist suffered critical injuries in a wreck Monday morning that also involved a pickup truck on Interstate 75. According to evidence at the scene and statements from several witnesses, a motorcycle was traveling north in the 7000 block of I-75 when a pickup truck pulled from the emergency lane into the lanes of travel at a very low speed. The driver of the truck had been stopped beside the median wall and then attempted to pull into traffic.

Several motorists were able to swerve around the truck and witnesses stated that the driver of the motorcycle attempted to do the same, but clipped the back corner of the truck. After striking the truck, the driver was thrown from the motorcycle, severely injuring him.

Several passing motorists stopped and administered aid to the motorcyclist, but his injuries were very serious. A short time later, he was rushed to Erlanger Medical Center, where he remains in critical condition with a severe head trauma as well as numerous other fractures.

The driver of the 2002 Yamaha Warrior motorcycle was 40-year-old Joseph Wilson of Ringgold, Ga. The driver of the 1999 Ford F-150 pickup truck is 63-year-old Jin Sung Chung of South Pittsburg, Tn. He was charged with reckless driving.

Joe Cool's Biker Health



Exercise is good for your body, but overdo it and you may unknowingly cause harm. The most common injury is often pulled muscles but over exercise can affect your body's ability to fight off illness. Intense training can increase your chances of catching a cold or the flu due to overexertion.

People who train excessively can lower their body's defense mechanisms. This suggests that after an exhausting training, the body's immune system is more susceptible to being attacked by bacteria or viruses. Respiratory illnesses are more prevalent, especially during the cooler months.

Take precautions by maintaining good hydration during and after rigorous exercise sessions. Try sport replacement drinks to replenish much needed electrolytes. Eat a healthy balanced diet of carbohydrate and proteins. Get plenty of rest after hard training days. Try to rest for 24-48 hours to allow the body to rebuild and replenish needed energy stores. Avoid over training at the onset of any exercise program.

Start slow and pace yourself.

Begin your exercise program gradually. After becoming accustomed to a certain level of exercise, switch to an activity that is more demanding. After warming up, move on to the conditioning period. The phase of activity that actually helps to improve cardiovascular fitness. You should concentrate on moderate not exhaustive-intensity. Do not push on until you are nearing collapse or breathlessness. If you are not on a regular exercise regimen, this conditioning period should last 10-20 minutes or longer if the activity is intermittent, as in tennis. If you exercise regularly, you'll be able to increase the intensity of activity gradually without becoming totally exhausted. Immediately following the exercise period, cool down by walking for a few minutes so that your body can readjust gradually to the decreased physical demand.

Be active without being overactive. If your body is in a weakened state due to over training, you may not be able to continue with your activities because you do not feel well enough to improve your fitness. Be smart and exercise smart. See you on the road.

BILLY LANE ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH MANSLAUGHTER

ORLANDO, Fla. - A motorcycle shop owner who has appeared on the Discovery Channel's "Biker Build-Off" was arrested Monday and charged with drunken driving manslaughter in the traffic death of a biker.

William "Billy" Lane, 36, registered a blood alcohol level of 0.192 percent, more than twice the legal driving limit of 0.08. He was also driving with a suspended license for refusing to take an alcohol breath test after a June incident in North Carolina, Florida Highway Patrol Trooper Kim Miller said.

Lane, owner of Melbourne-based Choppers Inc., attempted to pass two cars Sept. 4 in his 2006 Dodge Ram pickup despite a double-yellow line, Miller said. He struck 56-year-old Gerald Morelock, of Melbourne Beach, on his Yamaha Motorcycle, killing the man at the scene, Miller said.

Investigators are still trying to determine how fast Lane was going. Miller said Lane originally refused to submit to alcohol tests this time also, but complied when officers told him the bloodwork could be forcibly taken because the crashed killed someone.

Accompanied by his attorneys, Lane turned himself in at a Florida Highway Patrol station, Miller said. He was also charged with DUI serious bodily injury and driving on a suspended license involving a death. He was booked into the Brevard County Jail on \$15,000 bond.

An assistant for Lane did not immediately return a telephone message left at Choppers Inc. on Monday afternoon. Lane attorney Kepler Funk said through a receptionist he would issue a statement later Monday.

If convicted, Lane faces up to 15 years in prison each for DUI manslaughter and driving on a suspended license in conjunction with a death, both second-degree felonies.

The tattooed, dreadlocked man has grown acclaim building custom-made motorcycles, writing two books on the subject and appearing on several television shows, including the "Biker Build-Off" and "Monster Garage." Last year he was featured in a Discovery special on his "Blood Sweat and Gears" tour.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 06, 2006 LANE BEATS NORTH CAROLINA CHARGE

Custom motorcycle builder and TV personality Billy Lane, appearing Thursday in a North Carolina court, was found not guilty of driving a motorcycle while intoxicated after a three-hour trial before a judge.

Lane had refused to take a Breathalyzer test after being stopped in June. The refusal forced the suspension of his driver's license, but also left prosecutors without any evidence to present in a Rowan County court. Lane's attorney, James Davis, called several witnesses who testified that Lane drank only one beer that night in North Carolina.

Lane, however, still faces DUI and "driving with a suspended license causing a death" charges in Brevard County after a Sept. 4 head-on crash on State Road A1A that left a motorcycle rider dead. Because his license was revoked in North Carolina, he had lost his right to drive in Florida at the time of the fatal accident.

"Regardless of the outcome in North Carolina, he was still driving with a suspended license when he got involved in the crash at Brevard County," said Sgt. Michael Brown of the Florida Highway Patrol. "We have our own case," Brown said. "The investigators are confident they have a good case against Mr. Lane."

The victim's family was stunned by the decision. "Oh, God," said Morelock's brother, Byron, a financial consultant. "This is unbelievable. I swore to my boy, 'This ain't gonna happen here.' 'This is a joke,' he said. 'This guy killed my brother. I'm disappointed in (North) Carolina.'"

Florida Highway Patrol Homicide Investigator Sgt. Channing Taylor said that Lane, who had been at two bars before the accident, was attempting to pass three cars at night on a double-yellow line when he hit a mini-Yamaha driven by Sebastian Inlet Park Ranger Gerald Morelock. The accident severed Morelock's leg and sent his body flying to the pavement. Taylor said he died instantly. Lane, who was injured along with his passenger, 22-year-old Erin Derrick, submitted to a blood alcohol test after being told he had no choice, but did not give a statement to investigators. The test showed Lane had a blood-alcohol level of .192, more than twice the legal limit of .08. His attorney in Brevard, Kepler Funk, said he is investigating the incident as he prepares for trial. "Things aren't always what they appear," Funk said. "Just because somebody gets accused of something doesn't mean they did what they're accused of doing."

Boog's comment last issue that apparently everybody had an uncle who rode a Harley got me thinking and was cause for my taking a road-trip down memory lane.

I did not have the good fortune to have a relative with such cool factor, but I did have a neighbor, Jim Peterson who bought a brand new Electra Glide in 1963. Jim gave me a ride on the Panheads's huge white "Buddy seat." I, of course, was ruined for life!

Jim's bike was what he called a "magenta" color that his wife picked out. (I thought it looked "pink" and made a mental note that someday, when I bought my first Harley, it would be black!)

Do you remember the Harley ad of a few years ago that showed a baby with a Bar and Shield® adorned blanket that begged the question, "When did it first begin for you?"

I think it "began for me" that summer in '63, when I was eleven and my old man "let me" run the lawn mower for the first time. The feel of power and the response of a throttle in my hand. Argh, Argh, Argh!

Not content to just ride on someone else's machine, I soon went through a series of Stingray bicycles, go-karts and mini-bikes that lasted until I could get a drivers license and a beat up old Norton Commando in 1967.

If you built go-karts or mini-bikes in the early 60's, you were either a "Tecumseh" or "Briggs and Stratton" fanatic. I was a "Briggs Boy." Brand loyalty was not a fashion statement back then. You had their motor oil running in your veins or you didn't. I didn't get the familiar B&S "Bar and Diamond" tattooed on my arm though.

I am not sure the statute of limitations has run out, but the summer of '64 was when highway crews first began the practice of suspending cement mixers (or any engine with a "horizontal-shaft" engine or centrifugal clutch) in the air with cranes to keep them from "walking away". There probably wasn't a wheelbarrow in a ten-mile radius of my house that had a five to six inch, air-tire left on it by the end of the summer of '65. The mini-bike spent more time broken down than it did running. One day, an "older kid" (maybe seventeen-eighteen) in the neighborhood, Greg

Bruins, stopped by and gave me a hand. Greg was what my parents referred to as a "Juvie" or a J.D. (Juvenile Delinquent.) He lived in his parent's garage, wore white tees, with cigarettes rolled up in the sleeve and drove a rat Merc. I swear he was the original Arthur Fonzielli! Not the goofy "shark-jumping Fonzie," but the earlier rendition of the late 50's/early 60's loner, who if you were thirteen at the time, was James Dean incarnate.

Greg spent an entire summer afternoon showing me how to clean out the carb bowl, tighten the head-bolts to make sure I wasn't losing compression, and align the rear sprocket. He offered me a cigarette and I would have smoked it, if he was serious, but he was just messing with me. Greg was a mentor to me; he just didn't know it at the time.

But as Tupac says, "Back to the lesson at hand..." Several years ago, I was honored with the privilege of being on the Selection Committee to select our areas "Firefighter of the Year." Their own personnel selected a candidate from each of their eleven stations and I had the daunting task of trying to pick out the best from the best. Given the nearly impossible choice of trying to select only one individual to represent the rest of his peers, I asked just two questions; "Did you have a mentor when you were a rookie who showed you the ropes?" and "Who are you mentoring today?"

Every one of the firefighters had no problem immediately volunteering the name of their personal tutor. They all beamed with pride as they related to me stories of how some veteran took them under their wing when they were an impressionable recruit. But when I posed the follow-up question, "Who are you mentoring today?" All but a few froze and returned the look of a deer caught in the headlights.

You see, we all probably had some uncle or neighborhood character that helped us learn the motorcycle way of life and its code of lifestyle. Like Jim or Greg, they probably were not even aware of their influence at the time.

I now ask you, "Who taught you the love of motorcycles?" and more importantly, "Who are you mentoring today?"

Look around. It is likely you are impacting someone. I challenge you to reach out a hand to that twelve-year old down the block! Years from now, you could be the image that comes to mind when he (or she) is asked, "how did it begin for you?"

Blowing Smoke

When every newbie starts riding, they dream of the day that they can plan and ride a long distance ride. Generally, due to needing practice, the confidence level, or whatever the case may be, this can take some time.

My Dad tried to get me to travel out west with him back in June just a few weeks after I got my license and motorcycle. Well, I wasn't sure I could do it back then due to those factors listed above and the fact that my dad is a 600+ miles a day, here to the west coast in 2 days, hardcore, pedal to the metal, iron butt.

Well, I got to experience my first ride of any major distance not too long ago. However, my ride didn't get planned. It was kind of a spur of the moment 2 day trip that somehow ended up lasting a week, but hey, sometimes those are the best kind, right?

It was a holiday weekend that signified the end of summer and the beginning of cooler temperatures. Well, what did 2 beach bums decide to do? Head to the closest beach, of course. Tony, on the Sportster, and me, on my Boulevard, jumped on I-75 and headed south, deciding about halfway to Atlanta that Savannah and the nearby islands would be our destination. We did well through Atlanta, but by the time we reached I-16 both of our butts hurt so bad we could barely get off the bikes. (Go ahead, laugh, you know you've been there at some point, too!!!) Rule #1: When traveling long distances, be sure to make the necessary purchases and adjustments to ensure your comfort throughout the ride. In our case, we both had the stock seats which, although comfortable for previous day rides, proved to be inadequate for this trip. A problem we remedied while gone for the Sporty and as soon as I got back for the Boulevard.

We found civilization about halfway across I-16 and decided to get a room and drive to the coast the next morning. For those of you who haven't ventured across I-16 after Macon, don't expect civilization for at least 100 miles then don't expect it again until Savannah. It's a long, straight, dark road, and the night we were there it just so happened to be COLD!!! Us, being the smart people we are, decided that since we were going South leathers would not be required. I'd paid someone to bring me my leathers that night!

The next day we awoke to warmer temperatures, but cloudy skies. For this reason, we decided to alter our plans and head down a little further South into Florida. By the way, that no helmet law thing didn't hurt our decision either. Rule #2: When planning a long distance ride be sure to actually PLAN your trip, including your route, stops, and weather forecasts. I'm a natural planner so this fly by the seat of my pants thing was a little difficult for me but I think I did ok with it.

After we crossed the state line, pulled in the first gas station to remove that now unnecessary gear we had previously been required to wear, we jumped on A1A. A1A, as you probably know, runs along the coast, and from the state line to Jacksonville there are all sorts of state parks; it makes for one very beautiful ride. With all the state parks the road lacks one very essential thing - gas stations!!! Yes, we ran out of gas, well, the Sporty ran out of gas. Luckily, we were less than 1/4 mile from the gas station when this happened, so things weren't too bad.

We filled up and headed on down A1A to Ormond Beach where we visited Bruce Rossmeyer's Destination Daytona. Even if you're not a Harley Davidson fan this is still a very cool place to visit that includes an \$80/night hotel rooms, restaurants, and shops, along with the largest Harley dealership in the country. Inside you can walk through the history of Harley as you walk through the dealership. What do I mean, you say? It's like a museum; on display is a 1921 Harley, a 1941 army bike, a 1951 Servi-car mail trike, 2002 Jet Bike, a V-Rod drag bike, and a

2002 Boss Hoss trike, not to mention all the new Harley and American Iron horse models. Besides all the bikes, the amount of clothing and HD accessories and memorabilia there is amazing. Definitely, one place to visit if you're in the area.

We left Destination and headed towards the beach, booking a room with a Jacuzzi that overlooked the ocean, which felt very good on our sore muscles. One thing to consider on your next trip. The next morning we got up and decided that since we'd come this far, we needed to venture to the west coast of Florida. We jumped on I-4 to Orlando, the Florida Turnpike to Ocala, and then just as we got on US 98 the skies darkened. We'd just been bragging about how we'd made the trip without getting caught in any rain, we jinxed ourselves. All of sudden, the bottom fell out and we were left scrounging around our saddlebags digging for rain suits. We both started laughing at the irony of the situation and between the laughter and the downpour we were soaked by the time we got suited up and back on the road. Rule #3: Be sure to have appropriate gear with you whether it be for cold or warm weather, and a rain suit is always a good idea. Dressing in layers can also be helpful.

Finally, the rain cleared as we hit the National Forest on US98, which is another long, flat, straight road, but unlike I-16 this one is 2 lanes and lined with trees. The road was all ours for 99% of the ride, but I promise we abided by all speed limit and lane laws. Yeah right!!! The rest of our trip was pretty uneventful until we got to Panama City. You're probably thinking Panama City - yeah, I know what they were doing - partying! I wish! We were staying with a friend of ours and decided to head out to the beach, when the clutch goes out on the Sporty. Rule #4: Check your bike over before you head out on a trip including checking the tire tread and pressure, making sure the cables are adjusted and lubricated, positioning the headlight correctly, changing the fluids, and always check that most neglected part of a motorcycle - the air filter. These things don't last forever, and a bad air filter could cost you extra dollars at the pump and really hurt the performance of your ride, so do yourself a favor and check it! Also, having a qualified mechanic go over your bike before going a longer distance ride is a very good idea.

Even when you follow this rule, there are always things that you cannot plan for, which is what happened to us. The clutch spring broke, but luckily the bearings didn't lock up even though they needed to be replaced now too. We called every little shop in the area looking for those \$17 worth of parts, but as luck would have it NO ONE had them and it was Saturday. Yeah, you know what happened. We ended up renting a truck to get our bikes home, but it was either that or wait until the middle of the next week to get the parts to fix it.

Before the clutch incident, we hit 1,100 miles, had ridden along both the Atlantic and Gulf coasts of Florida, and overall had a great time. The trip was one of those I'll always remember and treasure.

Now, I'm sorry to inform all of you that Bikers Chattanooga has closed its doors, at least for now. I will be helping my family out some at RT Cycles Suzuki Yamaha, especially with the accessories. If you're looking for racks for your Rhino, a seat or wind-shield for your long ride, or you just want to add some chrome for the bling factor, come see me. Suzuki, Yamaha, Kawasaki, Honda, Harley or any other brand, as long as you've got your knees in the breeze you're cool by me. I'll find you the best price around on any accessory you can think of.

Moved by the case of Jessica Lunsford, who at the innocent age of nine was kidnapped, raped and buried alive by a convicted sex offender just yards from her Florida home, Big Norm organized a two week motorcycle ride across the state of Tennessee to raise awareness about Jessica's Law, a law with strict sentencing guidelines for child predators. Big Norm set a goal of gathering 250 petition signatures at each stop during his fourteen day ride to drive the state of Tennessee to increase the severity of sentencing guidelines for sexual crimes committed against

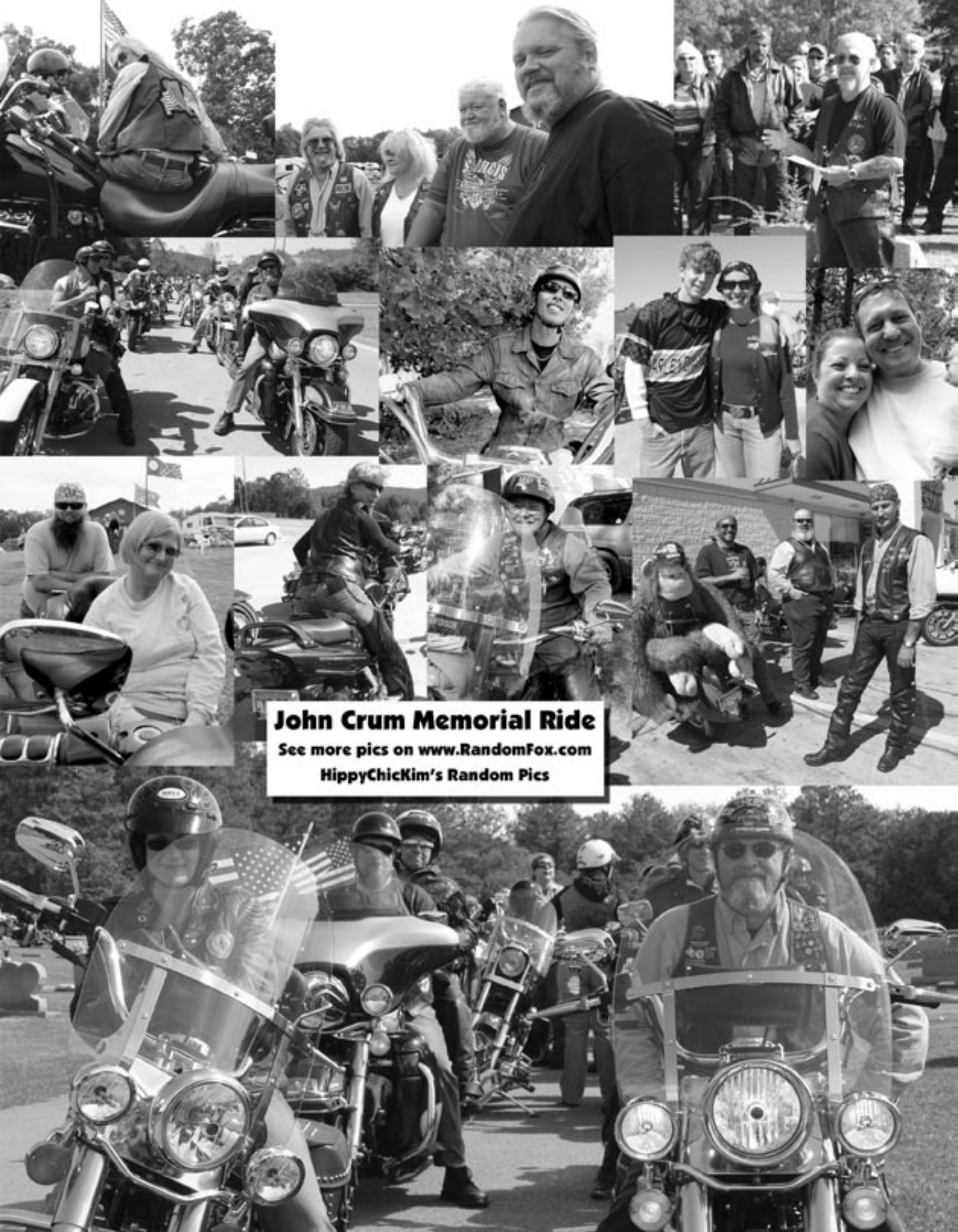

ONE OF OUR OWN

Glenn "Big G" Johnson



If you've ever seen a dude riding down a Chattanooga road on a purple Harley with his oxygen tank strapped to the back, chances are, you've already seen this month's One Of Our Own - Glenn "Big G" Johnson.

As I sat down with Glenn at one of his favorite hangouts (Rumors on Hixson Pike in Chattanooga), he told me story after story about his 64 years (he'd had a birthday the day before) and how motorcycles had made them more enjoyable. He told me about how he used to strap his sleeping bag on the springer front end of his bike and throw a plastic



sheet in his saddlebags where he could fashion a makeshift tent for roadside camping on longer trips. He explained how if he had to bring home more groceries than he could fit in his shoulder bag, he'd invite a passenger along on shopping trips where they could help hold the bags on the way home. Apparently, he was known to ride his bike regardless of the weather or the situation and his favorite time to ride is when the temperatures dipped down low enough for him to bundle up just a little.

Glenn kicked-off his motorcycle riding lifestyle at the tender age of 12 when he attached a motor to his bicycle. After catching the two-wheel bug, he mowed yards and saved

his money until he could purchase one of the famed Harley Hummer 125s. After a while, the 125 was traded for the slightly larger 165 at Pate's Harley-Davidson in Chattanooga (when it was on Main Street). Since then, he's owned and ridden an old Harley 45 (with the infamous "suicide" shifter), a Sportster, a '60 Panhead, a trike, Shovelhead, and a '79 Lowrider among others. Most recently he's settled on the '96 Dyna Lowrider you see pictured.

Glenn has been divorced for over twenty years and has three grown children: one son - Glenn Jr., and two daughters - Genny and Glenda. "I'm 64," Glenn says, "I've got a roof over my head, a good girlfriend, a red-nosed pit bull, a motorcycle, gas and oil... what more could I want?" He speaks quite highly of his girlfriend of five years, Teresa (or "Boomerang," as he likes to call her), who has been a great help through his recent health problems.

Glenn has suffered with COPD for a long time now, and now contends with congestive heart failure, Hepatitis C, cirrhosis of the liver and fluid buildup. In his own words, Glenn says he's "beat the odds" his whole life, but he's "on the short list" now. In fact, he highly praises Dr. Zeigler and Dr. Miller at Aventa Hospice for keeping him alive for the last year and a half (much longer than first anticipated). He says the people at Aventa have all been angels and hopes that a poker run or similar fundraiser can be set up to help them out in the future.


Although Glenn's legs have lost the strength required for him to ride his beloved bike, you can still see the desire and defiance in his eyes. "A motorcycle is something made to make you feel free," Glenn said, "Everything just blows off of you." "Life is too short and I know it," he says. "I'll live to ride it again." And that I don't doubt for a moment.

Dialog With **DIAMOND DAVE**

To a gearhead, nothing runs smoother, or sounds sweeter than a well-oiled machine. There is something inherently soothing about all those parts operating in mechanical harmony. Of course it helps to have 30 wt. in your blood like some of us do.

The life blood of all those metal parts working together is a fluid called oil. Oil is a very slippery substance indeed. And without it's lubricating properties, your motorcycles engine would be little more than a smoldering pile of metal.

Engine oil is rated by its ability to lubricate under different levels of hardship. You see this on the back of oil containers as the API rating. The more difficult the test, under which the oil still provides adequate lubrication, the higher the API rating.

Most of today's motorcycle specific oils require an API rating of at least a SG. Some of the better oils will have a SG/CF rating. The SG rating is for gasoline powered engines. The CF denotes the oil also passes the more stringent tests for Diesel powered engines. The best of engine oils will have an SH/CG rating. These oils will be the fully synthetic type as they are slicker, and longer lasting. By longer lasting, this means, stays cleaner longer. Engine oil does not wear out, it becomes diluted, and dirty with use.

Most motorcycle manufacturers would like for you to purchase their own brand of oil. Motorcycle manufacturers make bikes, not oil. Someone else makes their oil for them. Duh!

Follow your manufacturers recommendations for the oil grade, and weight to use. As long as the API rating is the same as theirs, you should be okay!

Motorcycle racing has provided us with many fantastic engine oils. We have all seen these brand names on the sides of many road racing rockets, as well as the many moto-cross events.

Racing has its own set of requirements for engine oils. While yours truly knows little about what these would be, many employees of Chattanooga Motorcycles do.
