When I first saw Sharon Rymer in 1966, little did I know that our paths would cross again some 40 years later. It was the fall of 1966 and like most male teenagers I was drawn as by an invisible force to two areas of the Olson Shows midway, the Wall of Death and Club Lido (the girlie show). The Olson Shows stopped in Chattanooga every fall and set up at Warner Park. This particular year there was a pretty young lady dressed in gold lame' pants, a black sequined top, and white motorcycle boots riding the rollers, attracting customers. The barker shouted "See Sharon Rymer from Cleveland, Tennessee ride the wall of death. As I had in years before, I bought my ticket and ascended the tall steps to watch these daredevils defy gravity and woo the crowd. The deafening sound, the speed, the smells, it was always exciting and a real bargain for a single dollar bill.

I met Sharon Rymer Wade electronically in 2004 after she

sent me a semi terse email about something I had written in one of my "Rock's Road" articles. In another part of my article I had mentioned the Wall of Death and the Olson Shows. As she closed her email, she informed me that she had ridden the Wall in Chattanooga in 1966 and 1967. My mind raced back as I remembered the young lady that rode the wall that

year. How cool is this, I thought. I finally met Sharon in person at Dr Dave's Christmas party one year and I've wanted to tell her story ever since. Now, I've got my chance.

Sharon Harper grew up in Cleveland, Tennessee. Being the only daughter of a gas distributor who had no sons, Sharon was raised a tomboy. She rode horses and did the things with her father that are usually reserved for sons. Although she was close to her strict family, Sharon had a wild, independent streak which would run afoul of her parents in her teenage years. She would walk down to the local hangout and get the "hoods" on motorcycles to give her rides on the back of their bikes. She was hooked for life once she experienced the thrill and freedom of having the wind in her face and the thundering sound of Harley-Davidsons. She got married at 16, and had a son, Rusty at 19. Her marriage was an unhappy one, but her family didn't believe in divorce, so she was unable to divorce her husband.

Sharon was dealing with her unhappy marriage when she took Rusty to the traveling carnival at Cleveland's Village Mall in in May of 1965. While Rusty was riding the kiddie rides she met Ralph Ritter and Jody Rogers who were riders on the Wall of Death. Being in need of another female rider they offered this pretty cow girl an escape from Cleveland and her marriage problems. She could think of nothing else after she returned home. The next day she and her best friend went back as the Olson Shows was breaking down to travel to their next town. The riders told Sharon to join them in Oak Ridge if she decided to run away. They would be in Oak Ridge for five days. Four days later, at age 22, Sharon packed her 1965 Mustang, left her son Rusty with her mother and secretly headed to Oak Ridge to join the carnival. She knew her family would come looking for her and she warned Ralph and Jody about this when she met them in Oak Ridge. The two riders and runaway Sharon decided to leave Olson and join the Royal American Shows, the world's largest carnival, which was currently in Memphis and heading for a tour of Canada in the next few weeks. While on the way to Canada, at a stop in Davenport, Iowa, her parent's private investigator found Sharon and her parents showed up on the midway. Her embarrassed mother stayed in the car and wouldn't watch Sharon perform, but her dad did watch one of

her shows before they returned to Cleveland without Sharon. They were unhappy indeed that their daughter was traveling with a carnival, but she was over 21 and they had no power to stop her. Sharon was going to do what Sharon was going to do. Period.

In Iowa, Ralph had started Sharon riding the go-cart on the flat circular floor at the bottom of the motor drome. After a few passes she took her cart up onto the first of the three levels. Ralph was yelling for her to stop as she proceeded up to the second level. She had complete confidence, knowing that she could ride this wall. She had no problem with dizziness like most novice riders. She didn't hit the vertical part of the wall that day, but that was short lived. Sharon found a Frederick's of Hollywood where she purchased a pair of gold lame' pants and a black sequined top. She found a pair of white Harley-Davidson boots which finished off her riding costume. Within a week, she started riding one of the rigid frame Hondas on the wall in unison with Jody. Two dames racing around the wall at the same time was a real crowd pleaser. Ralph was the trick rider and the one that snatched the bills being held over the top edge of the drome by the spectators. This money, the "ding" was held by the trio to cover any medical costs due to accidents. It was virtually impossible for drone riders to get insurance. At the end of the season, the balance of the "ding" would be split between the riders as a bonus.

Royal American Shows toured Canada thoughout the summer of 1965. Sharon performed as many as 35 shows per day. Unlike the Olson Shows that traveled by truck, Royal American traveled by train. Sharon waited tables in the dining car while traveling from city to city. Canda was a booming success. Eager customers would line the tracks as the carnival rolled into town. It was also very lucrative for Ralph and Sharon. Their two thirds share amounted to over \$14,000 for just one week's work. Sounds great until you realize just how many shows and hours it took to make that kind of money. Not to mention the risk.

At the end of the 1965 season Ralph was called by Rod Link, the owner of the Olson Shows, and offered the opportunity to run Olson's Wall of Death for the 1966 season.

## TEARS ON BLACK LEATHER

#### **Brothers and Sisters Down or Gone**

Longtime Atlanta and Chattanooga skater James Eric Carr, 33, died of injuries suffered in a motorcycle wreck on New Year's night at approximately 7:11 p.m. at the intersection of Ringgold Road and Donaldson Road in East Ridge.

East Řidge Police units arrived to find a serious accident between a gray Nissan pickup truck and a motorcycle. Preliminary reports indicate that the pickup was pulling onto Ringgold Road and was struck in the side by the motorcycle. The impact caused the pickup truck to flip and roll over at least one time. Eric was apparently killed upon impact.

Eric grew up in the Atlanta area. He moved to Chattanooga about three years ago, but made frequent road trips to Huntsville, Nashville and Atlanta for adult skating sessions, where he earned the nickname "Speed." He invested in his first motorcycle in '06, and loved his bike almost as much as his skates. Eric's greatest joy in life was being a father to his two children.

Monday January 10th. I had the privilege of joining in with the Patriot Guard as we rode escort in the funeral procession of a true hero.

Sgt. James Michael Sullivan was serving his second tour in Iraq when an I.E.D. blew up alongside the Humvee he was in killing him. Sgt. Sullivan did not have to be there, he volunteered to take the place of one of his

buddies who was not feeling good. He did not even have to be in Iraq he had been wounded during his first tour but refused the Purple Heartand instead he wrote his family saying "this is the right thing for me to do".

Among the hundreds of mourners at the church were his wife Michele and his son James Michael Sullivan Jr. who came into this world the day after his father left it, he will be a living legacy to his father. I felt both humble and proud to be allowed to ride as part of the approx. 150 bikes that were in the procession (some estimates were as high as 200 bikes). The funeral procession was well over one mile long as it went along some 20mi. from the church in Soddy Daisy to the National Cemetery in Chattanooga. All along the entire route were people, most with flags, many saluting some with signs saying God Bless You etc. Traffic on Highway 153 was completely shut down and people filled the northbound side of the roadway and continued on Amnicola Highway and on to the cemetery.

Tennessee has another name to join the likes of Alvin York in its Hall of Fame, the name of Sgt. John Michael Sullivan a true patriot and hero, may God Bless and keep you and your family.



## Joe Cool's Biker Health

For those avid Road Rash readers, you may remember during the spring of 2005 when I wrote several articles about my chronic knee problems and the subsequent knee replacement that took place at Memorial Hospital. Since then all is well and my knee condition has improved. However, I have another chronic complaint that some of our readers may relate to.

My most recent chronic complaint is from a condition called Lateral Epicondylitis, more commonly known as "Tennis Elbow". Exactly what causes tennis elbow is unknown, but it is thought to be due to small tears of the tendons that attach the muscles of the forearm to the arm bone at the elbow joint. The muscle group involved, the wrist extensors, function to cock the wrist back. Specifically, the extensor carpi radialis brevis, has been implicated in causing the symptoms of tennis elbow. What are the symptoms of tennis elbow? People with the tennis elbow syndrome experience pain on the outside of the elbow that is worsened by grasping and or lifting objects and cocking back the wrist.

The condition is considered to be an over use injury. Throughout my life I have been very active in sports. While in high school I played football and baseball. After graduation I continued to participate in active sports (sitting in the recliner


and watching someone else play the game never did it for me). Racquetball, golf, softball, bowling, and weight lifting have been my primary activities for most of my life. All these activities put a great deal of stress on my right elbow. Now, I find it very painful and difficult to continue to participate in my favorite activities. What really gets me, it hurts my arm to ride my motorcycle.

What have I done to help this chronic painful condition? I went to a doctor, who could not do much. This type of condition where the muscle and connective tissue is affected by inflammation, some steroid medication can be administered. However the best course of action is rest, anti-inflammatory medicine (Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen), ice therapy, and later, physical therapy to strengthen the wrist extensor muscles. A forearm brace that stabilizes the extensor muscle and keeps it from continued aggravation has

been helpful during rehab, when I want to try playing my favorite sport activities, as well as, when I want to ride my scooter on down the highway.

I hope I have been able to help our readers who may be suffering from the same elbow problems. I do not wish this kind of discomfort for anyone else. So, if any of my signs and symptoms are familiar to you, please seek medical assistance and try the therapy regime that has helped me get back on my feet or should I say, back on my elbow? Take care of your self, because if you won't, who will?


5: I know I have a reputation for dissing people for not

## Tammy Tells It

Greetings fellow riders,
I hope this finds you all
doing well. This month I
want to talk a little bit about
helmets. You can spend a ton
of money trying to find the
safest helmets out there, but
if they don't fit properly, they
simply aren't safe. Certain
manufacturers fit certain
shapes of peoples heads
differently. For instance, let's

say that you have an oval shaped head from forehead to the back, then a Vega helmet fits you better. If you have a round head, then an HJC helmet fits you better. Some people have a long head from forehead to chin, then an HJC is a better fit for you. Always make sure that the helmet fits you properly around the crown of your head. I mean fits tight, so that when you shake your head from side to side, the helmet moves with you and doesn't flop around. I know some of you have had this happen. You try on a helmet at a shop, it seems to fit you fine, then you ride around with it for a week or two and then it is simply too big. After you wear a helmet for awhile, the material starts to give. That is why it is so important to have a nice snug, not headache snug, but snug fit. Always try and put a finger on each side of your forehead, like at your temples, to make sure that there is no room, cuz if you get air in there it feels like it's going to pull your head off! If you ever have any questions or need advice on this, please feel free to come and see me and I will be glad to help. We do have a lot of helmets to choose from too!

That reminds me, all of our SHARK helmets are 10% off while supplies last. I also wanted to let you guys know that we carry helmets for kids! We have 2 styles to choose from, a full face and an open face helmet. We have an all black full face by HJC that sells for \$84.99 and also blue or pink graphic helmets for \$99.99. They really are nice helmets and very safe too. If you want to carry your kids or grandchildren on your bike and need a good helmet, come on by and check them out. The other open face helmets are by Vega and sell for \$49.99. Right now I know we have a pink one, but we probably have other colors







## A TRIBUTE TO AN AMERICAN HERO

#### Sergeant John Michael Sullivan

3 April 1984 - 30 December 2006

Sergeant John Sullivan was born 3 April 1984 in Chattanooga, Tennessee. He enlisted in the United States Army on 23 July 2003. He graduated One Station Unit Training as a 13B Field Artilleryman at Fort Sill, Oklahoma from Alpha Battery, 1st Battalion 40th Field Artillery.



Upon graduation from Basic Training he was assigned to Bravo Battery, 2d Battalion, 17th Field Artillery, Camp Hovey, Korea from December 2003 to July 2004 where

he served as number one man and Howitzer Driver. In these roles, he participated in numerous training exercises to help preserve peace on the Korean Peninsula. After eight months in Korea, the 2d Brigade Combat Team was called upon to deploy to Iraq in support of OIF III. While deployed in Ar Ramadi, Iraq SGT Sullivan served on the M109A6 155mm Paladin Howitzer as a Cannon Crewmember providing valuable counter fire missions while also conducting numerous mounted combat patrols throughout the Brigade sector.

In August of 2005 he redeployed from Iraq with Bravo Battery to Fort Carson, Colorado. While stationed at Fort Carson, Colorado he continued to train and hone his skills as an Artilleryman on the M119A2 105mm Towed Howitzer and also served as the Battery Commander's Driver. He was recommended to attend the Sergeant Promotion Board in July 2006 and was assigned to 1st Howitzer Section as the Ammunition Team Chief.





Last week as I was finalizing my "Counter Steer" column for this month, I had a turn of events that led me to re-think my subject matter. I was forced to have my 10-year-old Miniature Schnauzer "Cricket" put to sleep due



to the final stages of diabetes she suffered from, and it was one of the hardest things I have had to do in years. After the initial sedative shot in one of the vet's treatment rooms and prior to the final shot to stop her heart Cricket had about 10 minutes to just quietly lie in my lap for her final time of petting. As she lay there all I could think of was the way I had failed her as her master by being somewhat abusive at times when I felt she deserved punishment for certain things she had done. I feel punishment is appropriate at

times but I also know that I occasionally stepped over the reasonable bounds and now I pay the price with those negative memories when I think of this dog that had been such a part of our family's life. The fact that dogs are so forgiving gives me hope that she only had good memories, but I know that in so many ways I fall short in my life and this is just another example.

With the large number of readers that "Road Rash' serves there is a probability we have some readers who are involved in some form of abuse as a regular part of their lives, and I am not talking about dog abuse. Child and spouse abuse are illnesses that not only affect the ones being abused but also the abuser. Unfortunately, many times the children being abused latter as adults become the abusers while raising their own families. Prior to my

mother ultimately being sent to an orphanage, she and her eight sisters were temporarily raised by her father following her mother's early death. Her dad would lovingly care for the girls during the week by cooking, singing, and loving them in every way, but would come home drunk on weekend nights and throw then against the walls like rubber balls. My prayer is if you find yourself in a similar situation, knowing you are stepping over the limits, you

will take some sure steps to bring that cycle of despair to an immediate halt. Very few of us turn out to be the great parents or spouses that we once envisioned but that doesn't mean we can't change. Society has always labeled motorcyclers as being somewhat tougher and at the same time more



compassionate than most folks within the community. It takes a tough man to admit to the problem of abuse and even a tougher one to do something about it. If we are in fact more compassionate, then there is not a need more deserving of compassion than to protect our own family members. My prayer is if you suffer from this serious problem you will ask for God's forgiveness, your family's forgiveness, and then seek help to do something about it NOW. It is also my prayer that some day you will not have to look back at the way you failed your family, as I look back on my failure with "Cricket", but will be able to say "I did my best".

As Jesus was hanging on the cross, people verbally and physically abused him in every way imaginable and he just responded "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do". He offers true forgiveness upon the asking.





8) What is your favorite type of riding and what is your favorite local route (within 100 miles)?




