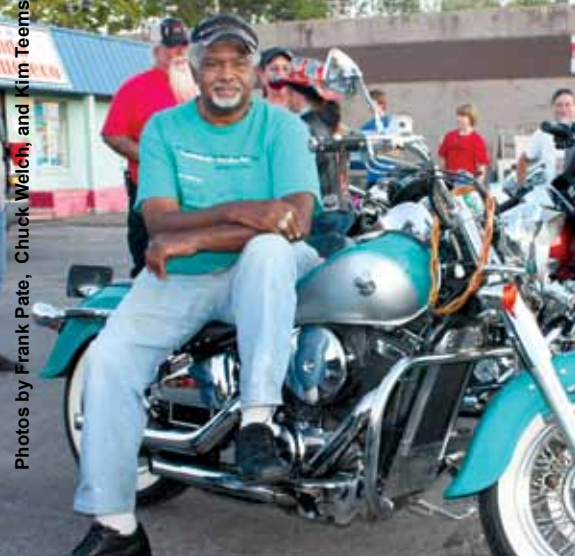

I spoke to customer service in India, Mexico, and the Philippines, but never an American. When I asked to speak to an American, I was told that there weren't any. Was I mad? Let's just say that these foreigners heard words that probably weren't in their English lessons. Using foreigners for customer service is reason enough to never use Priceline. I refuse to do business with companies that job their customer service out to boiler rooms outside the U.S. We need to keep our jobs right here at home instead of hiring foreign idiots that follow a script instead of actually helping you work out your problem.

I'll chalk it up to a learning experience, you should never get too old to learn something new. This lesson cost me a few hundred bucks.

Hey Kickers! I'm Jeff Griffith, a Chattanooga native. I got my first bike (PW 50) at the age of three and have been riding ever since.

I spent my younger years riding off-road. I participated in my first motocross race at four years old at Tunnel Hill (R.I.P.). I remember being terrified because some of the dirt wads were as big around as the wheels on my PW50. I barely made it to the first turn before the mud finally swallowed my front end. I still took the checkered flag in second place.

After that, I kept riding off and on, but it slowly became less important to me. That is until I turned 14, and could finally ride on the street. I got a GZ250 (technically illegal for a 14 year old). It wasn't much, but I was proud of it and rode it everywhere. I moved from there to a GS500, then to an '03 Honda VFR800.

My dad, Garry Griffith, has an identical VFR800. That allowed me to (try to) mimic his exact movements when we were riding together, which really helped me develop some skill on the street. One of the biggest things we

got to do together was Jamie James Championship riding school at Barber Motorsports. I was just 16 years old, and it was my first time on a track. We got to be the first people to ride a fleet of Yamaha R6's. When I got through a set of tires, I just hopped on another one. There were two days of intervals of riding and class time. It was great getting to know Scott Russell and Rich Oliver over the weekend.

When Garry Griffith Cycle started up again, I decided that I was going to get back into the motocross world. Now that I can drive myself to the track, it is much easier to go when I want to. Just a few races, and I was hooked. It was an every weekend event until I broke my collar bone in five pieces a few months ago. I'm getting back out there now, but not near as often as I would like to.

One thing keeping me from it is my brand new Beta 520RS supermoto. At just 245lbs (dry), it's a blast to take through the twisties. It was especially fun making all the sport bikes mad at the dragon recently. [See photo inset above]

Other than that, I love going out on an ATV or Side by Side when we have a demo here at the shop. I've ridden just about everything there is, and I'm proud to be part of the powersports community. I'm especially proud to be a part of KickStand Up! Magazine.

KENT'S APPLE BUTTER, PORK DOUBLE COLA & PECANS

There are some things that just seem to go together. Pork, apple butter, pecans and Double Cola are some of those things. The flavors mix well, it's perfect for a fall recipe and the ingredients are easy to come by. In fact, you may have everything in your kitchen right now.

This recipe is very easy and only requires a short time for the marinade and minimal stove top skills for the reduced Double Cola and pecan topping. And yes, you can substitute the Double Cola if needed.

Grab some nice, thick pork chops or pork steaks and coat them with apple butter, cover and chill. For the sauce, dice up some apples into small pieces. Then grab some chopped or crushed pecans, a Double Cola, or your favorite cola – not diet, pecans, a splash of hot sauce and a spoon full of butter. While the chops are cooking on the grill use your side burner, or cook inside, to heat the butter in a skillet.

Add in the pecans and apples to brown a bit. Then add in the coke careful not to burn yourself. It will foam up. Add a few dashes of hot sauce and allow the mix to reduce by a third before topping your chops. Be careful to not over reduce the sauce as the sugars in the sugar may turn bitter.

MX FLEXIBILITY

Most Motocross racers train for increased cardio performance and weight train to build strength and maintenance. However, there are four equally important components that should be in all racers training program: Cardio Conditioning, Muscular Endurance Training, Flexibility, and training of the Mind.

Unfortunately, probably the two most neglected elements of MX training are conditioning the mind and increasing flexibility. Yeah, you may see some racers stretching before their start. They'll bend down and touch their toes, stretch each arm behind them, and so on. The question is, are they really benefiting from that kind of stretching? Answer, probably not.

The lack of a strong warm-up and stretching routine (key word routine) can cost great dividends. Greater Flexibility will help you with:

- 1) Reduction in muscle tension
- 2) Prevent serious injuries
- 3) Attain a better level of physical and mental relaxation.
- 4) Increased Range of Motion (ROM) and improved Posture while on the bike.

Every workout should begin with a warm-up and stretching, in that order. Warming up is defined by raising your core body temperature. Stretching, which is self-explanatory is not warming up!

Think of warm-ups being in two phases.

- 1) The Primary Stage should consist of light aerobic work. Activity that will cause body temperature to rise, thus causing increased circulation of blood in and around the muscles. Think of yourself warming up the your engine, causing oil to splash around in the cases bathing the gears and other parts. Then think of yourself not warming your engine, and just cranking it and blasting off.
- 2) The Second Stage should involve two types of stretching Static and Dynamic Stretching. Static involves you just stretching the muscles, like you reaching for your toes. Dynamic involves moving the muscle being stretched actively through the entire ROM.

Remember, to avoid a common mistake used in stretching, NO BOUNCING at the endpoint. Bouncing actually will shorten the muscle. Also remember that keyword Routine. Routine is key, meaning the more you do it the better the results. It's just that simple.

WINTERIZING YOUR MOTORCYCLE:

With cold weather around the corner, we need to look at some important steps in taking care of your beloved motorcycles, Winterizing.

Rust, moisture, fuel oxidation, and battery failure are just a few of the problems associated with leaving your bike un-winterized and sitting up for the season. Now let's avoid these problems and go over the best way to winterize your motorcycle.

First, we need to prevent the oxidation of the gasoline and rust in your fuel tank. So you will need to fuel your tank completely up and add a fuel stabilizer to the fresh gas (Sta-Bil works great), then start your bike and let it run for 5 minutes. This will get the stabilized gas run through your carburetors or fuel injection system and prevent the gas from oxidizing or turning into "sludge". This also helps warm up your motorcycle to help drive out any unwanted moisture in your engine that can damage cylinders, piston rings, valve seats, and other important components.

The next step is to remove your spark plugs and pour a capful of fresh motorcycle oil down into the spark plug hole. With the plugs still out, turn the engine over by hand (put the bike in high gear and roll it forward until the engine turns over). This will help coat the valve seats, piston rings, and cylinders to avoid rust. Now you can replace your spark plugs back into the spark plug holes.

Then you will need to drain the existing crankcase oil, remove your old oil filter and replace it with a new filter, then refill the crankcase with the fresh motorcycle oil that your owner's manual specifies to use. This removes any used oil that may have small amounts of water in it that could cause rust inside your engine.

The last step is to make sure your battery stays charged. Letting your bike sit through the winter greatly reduces the life of your battery; so the best way to make sure you aren't buying a new one every spring is to invest in a battery tender. The tender keeps a slow charge on the battery without risk of overcharging and causing damage.

Other things that you may want to include: Washing/ waxing your bike to prevent corrosion from bird poop or other things that may be on your bike, changing antifreeze coolant to ensure your engine block doesn't crack, and plugging your exhaust openings to keep critters from building nests in your pipes.

That's about it. If you do all of these steps to winterize your motorcycle you will save yourself headaches and money come next spring.

The freedom, solitude, food, people, scenery, and just the experience have kept my mind ticking over for years. Well, now the time has come to stop dreaming, put rubber to the road and start riding. In May 2012, I will fly to Delhi, India and start my adventure.

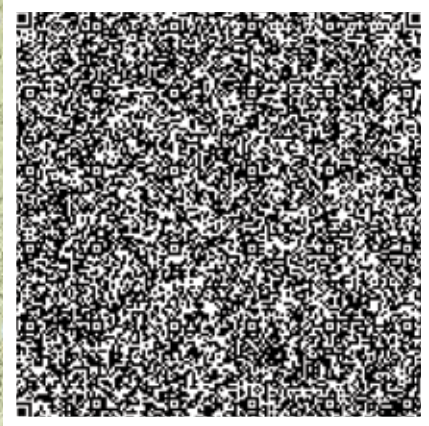
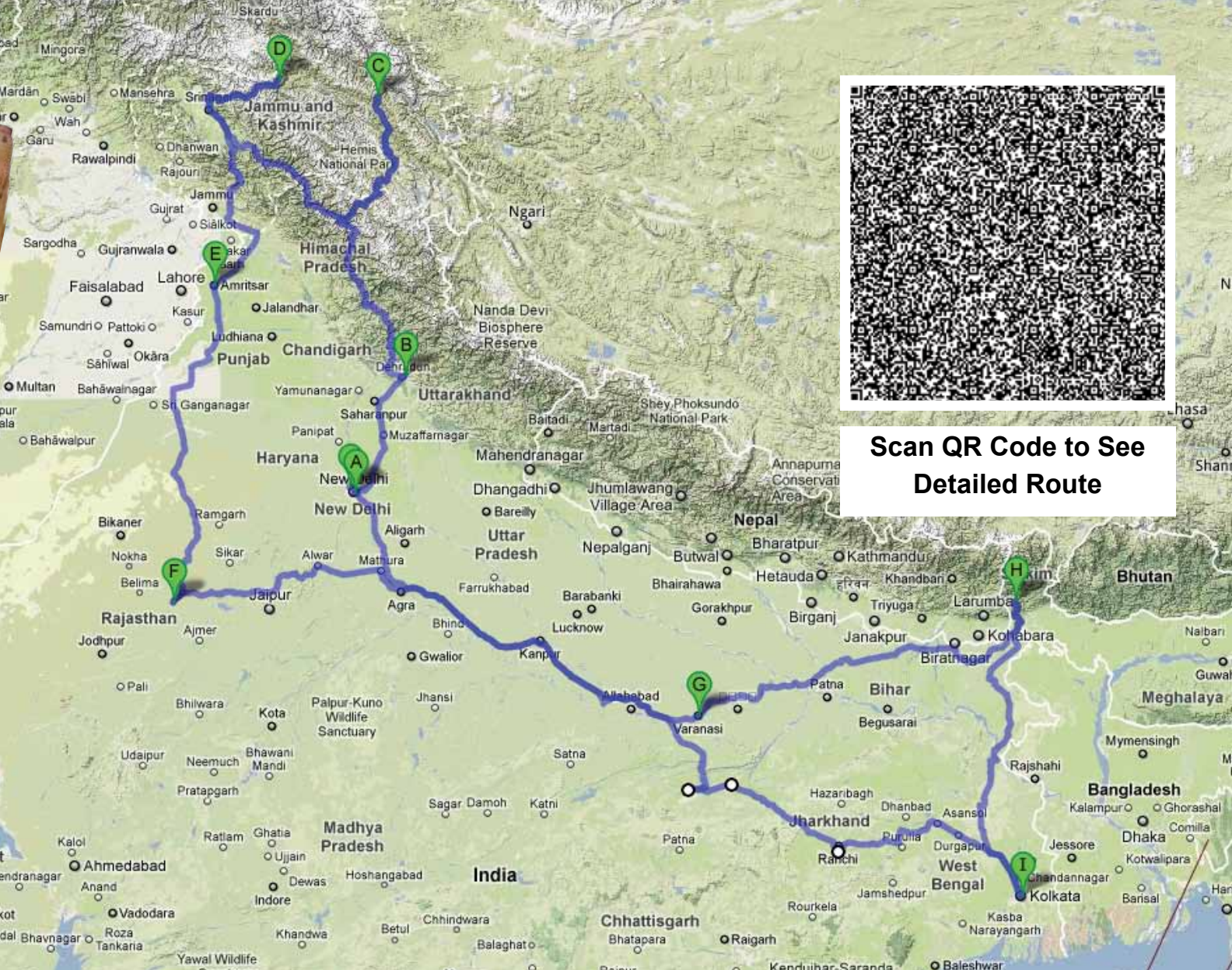
Being a lover of classic cars and bikes, I did my research, hunted around and...well my pony is going to a 1965 Royal Enfield. She was in a bad way and needed a full strip down to be brought back to her glory days. With a few phone calls and the proceeds of a money tree I have out back...she is now being restored. The Royal Enfield is a classic looking bike produced in India, which makes it a little easier to find parts for the restoration. If the bike does break down, I will be able to find parts in almost any small village I happen to be in. I can see already that I am going to be attached to her by the time my India experience ends, and there is already talk of having her shipped back State side.

section maxing out at 18,563 feet; looks like I am going to have to be "at one" with my carbi and just might need to rejeet the old girl once or twice on the ride.

After exploring Kashmir, I will ride on down to Rajasthan to see her beauty, on to the most holy of Hindu rivers, the Ganges. Then I will take a winding road up to Kathmandu. Now there is a small bar in Kathmandu owned by a couple of Australian motorcycle enthusiasts and, being an Australian native, I think it would be rude not to stop by and have at least one cold refreshing drink.

The route so far has me riding 3500 miles over 90 to 100 days. I am sure though, as the time draws near to my ride, there will be extra miles, cities, and places to adventure to while I am there. Starting in Delhi I will ride to Kashmir. This is most likely going to be the most challenging leg of the journey. With the Rohtang pass in the great Himalayas standing between me and my destination, the road is going to challenge me at every bend. The pass is at an average of 15,000 feet with one

From there it will be up to Base Camp on Everest, the roof top of the world. With another dream fulfilled I will take the long road down to Kolkata where the ride will come to an end and the journey will start.

As I planned out the ride and added up the costs, I looked at India and her people. With over one in every four people living in poverty, the cost of the ride would support around 30 families for one year. I already work with the homeless in Fort Lauderdale, but when I thought of India, I just wanted to make a bigger difference and really touch some lives. I did a little research and teamed up with **www.endpoverty.org**. They are a non-profit organization specializing in micro-financing. They go to people that would not normally receive a loan and help them to get started in their own business. The money is then paid back so it can be loaned out many more times. **Endpoverty** then take the time to teach people how to use money effectively, helping them to break the poverty cycle. **“Give a man fish, feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and feed him for a life time.”**

Seeing the work they do and the difference they make, let me know I had made the right decision in supporting their organization and drawing attention of the India’s poor.

finally bought her own bike. She had dated many bikers, and ridden as a passenger, but she didn't get to ride when she was single, so she got her own bike. It was a 1983 Honda Shadow 500.

Tammy says that, as a small woman, it was a little more difficult to pick up the skill of riding. Most bikes are heavy, and sit too tall for someone with a smaller frame. On some bikes, she can't even touch the ground or reach the controls. Nevertheless, she picked up the skill, and gets a lot of attention when people see her get off the bike and realize that it's a girl.

Riding gave Tammy some useful skills and knowledge that she has used in her career, working parts at a number of dealerships and brands. In 1995 she worked for Steel Harley-Davidson, in 2002 She worked for Indian Motorcycle of Chattanooga, in 2004 she worked for Southern Honda (spending some time at Polaris Victory Triumph), and now she works at Garry Griffith Cycle. All-in-all, that's 16 years of experience in parts. "I like all motorcycles," says Tammy, and with

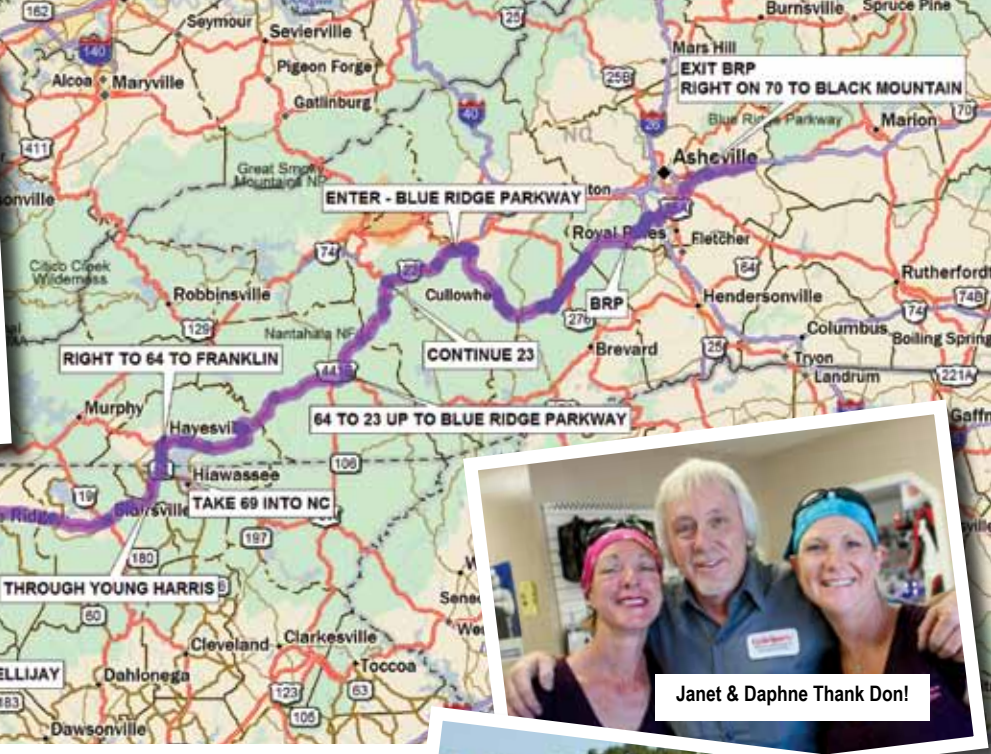

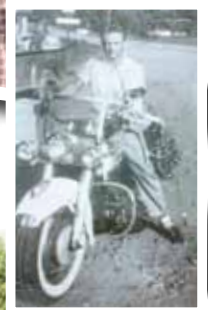
left more than a few young men blushing. We were a brilliant force of fun and mischief!

You ever tried to eat biscuits and gravy riding down the road on your bike? It's such a mess and really hard to clean up off of the motor. After 4 or 5 times I quit doing it. My poor wife was complaining about how hard it was to clean up. She can be so ungrateful sometimes.

We pulled into the Wheels Through Time together, as it is hard to get separated when you are only riding a block away. Immediately the owner, Dale Walksler, came out and informed us that since we were the best looking GoldWing group to ever show up dressed in our pretty blue shirts, that he was waiving the \$10.00 per person fee for our group. I liked Dale immediately.

He then began giving us a personal tour. He does that a lot from what I understand. He is energetic, enthusiastic and eager to share his hobby of hoarding. That's right, he is a world class hoarder who has found a way to share his treasures with everybody. The motorcycles in Dale's museum run. He starts many of them on the spot and used to do burn-outs with them on a daily basis.

Many of these antiques are in just

found condition, you see them as they have become and many of them have been restored but I believe that all of them run. It is worth the time to invest in this piece of Americana to see where our roots lie, from vintage motorcycles with the classic V-twin design to in line four and six cylinder machines that our American companies made. Every bike in there is an American made motorcycle. Or an American made product.

There is a Harley-Davidson ice cutting machine and the Elias Snow Toboggan, which is the predecessor to our snowmobiles of today. I know that in the south a toboggan is something you wear on your head, but up north they are long wooden sleds that you ride down the hills of snow on. If you don't believe me you can even look it up online.

Dale Walkser and his staff, including his son, are very friendly and knowledgeable about everything motorcycle. This is a great destination for anyone with great roads leading to it and plenty of places to eat. But you may not get to go see it next year.

He is moving next year. And there is no place yet for him to go. Maggie Valley and that area is more interested in hikers coming to visit, bringing their granola bars and recyclable water bottles. They have made it hard for him to stay there, even though thousands of bikers come visit that area every year and many of them, as we did, come to see his museum. Every restaurant was full of motorcycles and most of the gas stations had bikes parked in the driveway as people wandered in to buy bottles of water and trail mix. The Maggie Valley economy was getting a big boost from bikers on this Saturday.
