



WHAT'S IN STORE FOR 2012

The Tennessee 2012 legislation has begun and the political organization CONCERNED MOTORCYCLIST OF TENNESSEE/AMERICAN BIKERS ACTIVE TOWARD EDUCATION [CMT.ABATE] will be there protecting your

right to ride. For the 2012 legislative season

CMT/ABATE will be working on passing two bills.

The first one is **"THE FREEDOM OF CHOICE BILL"** this bill will allow 21 and over to ride without a helmet.

We would like Tennessee to become the 31st state that

KickStandUp.com

allows you to choose what to wear when riding your motorcycle. We have been working diligently with members of Tennessee Legislature and feel that we have a good chance of getting this bill to pass but there is still a lot of work to do.

If the motorcyclist of Tennessee wants this to become a reality your State Representative and State Senator will need to hear from you this year.

The second bill we'll be working on would expand the "**DUE CARE LAW**" to include all who use Tennessee's roadways.

At this time the "Due Care Law" can make violating a bicyclist or pedestrians right away that results in injury or death a Class A misdemeanor, which can carry a jail time up to 11 months and 29 days and a fine up to \$1000. The fine for violating a motorist right away that results in death or injury can be a Class B misdemeanor which can carry a jail time of up to 6 months and a \$500.00 fine. To give you some perspective on this getting caught doing a wheelie carries a fine up to \$500.00 with no one getting injured. Are we not worth more than \$500.00?

As always we will monitor any legislation that affects motorcyclist here in Tennessee. 

PRODUCT REVIEW



SUPERQUADRO

he new Superquadro engine is claimed to be the most powerful twin-cylinder in production. The Superquadro is named after its highly oversquare 112 X 60.8mm L-Twin. Besides its standard L-configuration and Desmodromic valve control system, Ducati started with a clean slate for the powerplant. Ducati rotated the top end of the signature 90-degree L backwards around the crankshaft which gives six-degrees more clearance on the front wheel and allowed the front-to-rear bias

to be skewed slightly to a 52% front bias. It also perfectly positioned the cylinder head attachments with the monocoque frame. The primary-drive and clutch casings, sump and cam covers are cast in magnesium alloy for weight savings. The crankcases use a shell main bearing for the crankshaft. a feature reserved for


the Desmosedici RR engine up till now, while the top of the crankcase apertures have separate nikasilcoated aluminum wet-liners. Its inlet

valves have been switched to titanium from steel and the diameters of both inlet and exhaust valves have increased, bumping up intake from 43.5 to 46.8mm while the exhausts are now 38.2mm, up from its previous 34.5mm measurement. The original belt-drive of the Desmodromic system has been replaced by a combined chain and gear-drive arrangement in order to control such large valves.

The chassis itself is frameless, with the swingarm being bolted directly to the engine cases and the carbon fiber headstock being bolted to the cylinder heads.

We at the Pandora's are all very very excited for this new machine. Stay tuned as first deliveries are slated for mid-March!

Kent's Easy Baked Italian Chicken & Pasta

Looking for a dinner for two that is simple, small in portions, full of flavor and easy to make for Valentine's Day? Well, here is a suggestion that fits the bill. The idea behind this dish is quick and easy with little cleanup so you and your better half can have time for other things besides doing dishes and staying in front of the stove for hours. Another plus is that you can substitute several ingredients or apply the basic idea to one of your favorites.

Make the chicken and pasta in small portions, use pre-cooked chicken if possible, use basic ingredients and seasonings and the cheese of your choice. The salad adds an extra layer of flavor and the wine adds a special touch. I'll leave the dessert up to you.

Kent's Easy Baked Italian Chicken and Pasta - Serves two 1 cup cooked chicken chunks 1 1/2 cups cooked wheat pasta Italian seasoning Minced garlic Olive oil Italian Blend Shredded Cheese Flavored tomato sauce if desired Chopped tomato or peppers if desired

Cook or thaw precooked chicken chunks season with Italian seasoning and set aside. Cook pasta as per directions on box. In a pan sauté chicken, minced onion and additional small amounts of onion, pepper etc. Use small amounts, chopped fine. Saute in olive oil. Combine with noodles, toss with tomato sauce if desired, place into small carafe dishes or small baking dish with non-stick spray. Top with cheese and bake at 375 until cheese bubbles. Serve warm, careful single serve dishes will be hot! Feel free to add your favorite spices etc.


The founders of the organization are Jim and AmyJo

Childhood Cancer Facts

Childhood cancers are the #1 disease killer of children - more than asthma, cystic fibrosis, diabetes, and pediatric AIDS combined.

Childhood cancer is not a single disease, but rather many different types that fall into 12 major categories. Common adult cancers are extremely rare in children, yet many cancers are almost exclusively found in children.

Childhood Cancers are cancers that primarily affect children, teens, and young adults. When cancer strikes children and young adults it affects them differently than it would an adult.

Attempts to detect childhood cancers at an earlier stage, when the disease would react more favorably to treatment, have largely failed. Young patients often have a more advanced stage of cancer when first diagnosed. (Approximately 20% of adults with cancer show evidence the disease

has spread, yet almost 80% of children show that the cancer has spread to distant sites at the time of diagnosis).

Cancer in childhood occurs regularly, randomly, and spares no ethnic group, socioeconomic class, or geographic region.

The cause of most childhood cancers are unknown and at present, cannot be prevented. (Most adult cancers result from lifestyle factors such as smoking, diet, occupation, and other exposure to cancercausing agents).

One in every 330 children will develop cancer by the age of 20. On the average, 12,500 children and adolescents in the U.S. are diagnosed with cancer each year.

On the average, 1 in every 4 elementary school has a child with cancer. The average high school has two students who are a current or former cancer patient. In the U.S., about 46 children and adolescents are diagnosed with

cancer every weekday.

While the cancer death rate has dropped more dramatically for children than for any other age group, 2,300 children and teenagers will die each year from cancer.

Childhood leukemia (making up the largest group of childhood cancers) was once a certain death sentence, but now can be cured almost 80% of the time.

Today, up to 75% of the children with cancer can be cured, yet, some forms of childhood cancers have proven so resistant to treatment that, in spite of research, a cure is illusive.

Several childhood cancers continue to have a very poor prognosis, including: brain stem tumors, metastatic sarcomas, relapsed acute lymphoblastic leukemia, and relapsed non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.



"Wag," the original owner who was a friend and neighbor, bought the bike new in 1972. He and his son rode it in the woods for two years which accounts for the dents, scrapes and scratches in it's three thousand miles. He then parked the bike in his garage where it gathered dust. I had been after him for years to sell it to me, but he never would until September 2009. He warned me it didn't run. He sold me the bike and a "new" (unused) battery for sixty dollars. That's the battery in it now.

I took the bike, which I call "Gerry" (short for geriatric), to Chattanooga State Community College where, with a replacement carburetor, the motorcycle tech people managed to get it running. It smoked like crazy, so we knew a major engine rebuild was in order.

The hard part was acquiring parts for a bike that old, but Doctor Vince Langford, of Honda of Chattanooga on Highway 58, did a remarkable job of finding many parts. The rest came from searching eBay and included some parts from southeast Asia. Shipping cost was sometimes more than the parts cost.

Replaced the tires and tubes,

bore out the cylinder, added over sized piston and rings, replaced the timing chain guide and a valve, and I now have one hundred cubic centimeters of throbbing power between my legs, and it usually starts on the first kick. Gerry gives me from 75 to 85 miles per gallon depending on the wind, at up to a tad over 55 mph running back and forth in fair weather from Greater Metropolitan Red Bank, TN, to work five miles away and now has 5,207 miles on him.

I keep the bike factory stock except for the automatic smile generator mounted on the handlebars on the left. It really works, and works well!



When she first got her bike, the carburetor needed to be rebuilt and the paint had to go. She rebuilt the carburetor herself and then set to work on the paint. She painted her frame pink and christened her "Princess." She says she created stars on her tank using flat black paint and, "257 stickers; I used 43 for practice." Her next step is to rewire the entire bike. I asked her if she'd do that too and she replied, "Of course. It's not like I haven't messed with it before; I'm always catching and fixing shorts."

One of her frustrations of working on her own bike is the response she gets from the male population. For example, at Nightfall one evening her bike wouldn't start. Tabatha says, "Suddenly, all these men floated around and pushed me away from my bike. I said, 'Wait a minute' and pushed back through, fixed the problem, and fired her up. That was a good feeling."

MX CARBS

ompetitive activity requires extra energy intake. Riding or Racing Off road certainly falls into this category. Dietary plans that provide the most efficient energy sources will help the athlete succeed. Carbohydrate Loading is a well-entrenched strategy. Several factors influence the energy required for a success. The type, intensity and frequency of training as well as size, age, and sex are major factors that influence energy needs. Such as a weekend warrior's energy needs are much different than a seasoned professional's.

There are three sources for energy carbohydrates, fats, and proteins. Proteins are used primarily for growth, maintenance, and repair, rather than an energy source. In fact, high use of protein for energy proves to be inefficient and may lead to liver and kidney problems. Carbohydrates and fats are your best choice for fuel for all types of activities. Carbs are used as the initial fuel, especially where short bursts of energy are needed. The combination of Carbs and Fats are used for more sustained energy.

The body stores limited amounts of carbohydrates as glycogen. The amount of energy used from glycogen is about 1900 calories. When these stores run low, so does your bodies performance levels.

Carbs are the best overall source of energy. In fact, Sports Nutritionists recommend that 55 to 65 percent of intake calories come from carbohydrates. However, these nutrients should be used in accordance to (1) Training goals (2) Time of day, and (3) Body Type. The old concept of Carbohydrate Loading revolved around depleting the carbohydrate stores then replenishing them day's prior to competition. This technique had some ill effects.

The modified plan will call for a carbohydrate intake of 530 grams or 65 percent of all calories from carbohydrates three days prior to competition. However, it should be noted that intake higher than this will not contribute any significant advantage and may even be more harmful. Nutritionists recommend 50-60 grams of carbohydrates per hour to fuel most athletes.

Fat is another important fuel source. Aerobic training increases the body's ability to use fat as a fuel. However, fat cannot be used exclusively, because Fats breakdown process produces a waste byproduct that will in fact limit stamina.

Carbohydrate Loading should only be done with the advise of a Health Care Professional.



THE RIDE ALONG MAUI'S COAST TO HANNA

> The road to Hanna is 52 miles long with 617 curves, 56 bridges...

> t was a typical Maui morning, mid 70's sunny with a light breeze. We picked up the rented street glide and headed for the road to Hanna. The road to Hanna is 52 miles long with 617 curves, 56 bridges most of them one lane and countless breathtaking stops along the way.

> We started down the coast from the Northern town of Pa'la along the North coast and watched the windsurfer's taking advantage of the beautiful morning waves.

We continued along the winding road using much of the sidewall on the Street Glides wide front tire. The speeds along the road to Hanna are quite low 15 to 25 miles an hour in most curves. Around every curve there just seems to be another discovery of a waterfall or Bamboo field. The Mountain apple trees had dropped some of their flowers to make a bright Red carpet under them. Further along are the Rainbow Eucalyptus trees that have no bark on the trunk. Just a smooth rainbow like finish that is even more pronounced when wet.

Did I say wet, yep you can count on a short rainfall on your trip to Hanna as it is the rainforest. If memory serves me correctly, they told me that area gets 365 inches of rain a year. Don't let that distract you though, the ride is usually only wet for a few miles then you are back to paradise.

About halfway through the ride will take you to the Ke'anae Peninsula to take in more beautiful sights. That is where the pictures are from. The waves crashing along the shoreline most times are 15 feet high. The rest of the road down to Hanna is nothing short of spectacular. With all the stops along the way to take in the sights and get some pictures your trip to Hanna will take around five hours. Then you can make the decision to go back or continue to the Seven sacred pools in Ohe'o, which is in Haleakala National Park in Kipahulu. This is a must see attraction in my opinion.

At this point you do have to turn around and go back out the way you came in as there are no paved roads to continue any further south. So take your time enjoy all the sights along the way down, stop often as you will miss many beautiful sights along the way if you don't. Now for the icing on the cake! Get on the scooter and enjoy every inch of that curvy road on your way back. It is a ride you will never forget!



DISCOVER Little River Canyon

More takes about an hour and a half one way. You'll travel a lot of cool country back roads and the scenery is great. My route takes about an hour and a half one way. You'll travel a lot of cool country back roads and the scenery is great. My route has a very steep ascent and is probably not for newbie's. There is a tamer way to see Little River Canyon if you come in from the Ft. Payne direction. If you are in a hurry, catch I-59 in Ft. Payne for a faster trip home. I guarantee you that once you experience this amazing place you will return time and time again. Each season has something different to offer. Even in the summer the traffic is light, while in the winter you might not even see another vehicle. It's a magical place.

Little River is one of the nation's longest rivers that forms and flows for most of it's length atop a mountain (Lookout Mountain.) The river plunges off the mountain at the head of Little River Canyon. The canyon is one of the most extensive canyon and gorge systems in the eastern United States and one of the South's clearest, wildest waterways. The river is small in the summer, but surges with the rainfall in the cooler months. Although it is impressive during the summer with the canopy, it is much more impressive after the leaves have fallen. Then you can see the real depth of the gorge.

Congress added Little River Canyon to the National Park System in 1992. The Preserve protects 14,000 acres of the 199 square mile Little River watershed and many rare, threatened, and endangered species of plants and animals.




